## SA FONT NOVA ROUTE

In the past, this road was used by the people of Galilea who went to work on the Galatzó estate. It currently serves as a link with the network of public foot paths of the municipality of Puigpunyent.

This route, some 6,3 km long and highly interesting in terms of its scenery, heritage and nature, begins at the houses on the Galatzó estate and heads south along the Galatzó road until it reaches the area of Galilea.

There is a series of heritage, architectural and ethnographical sites along the route that clearly highlights the forestry activities carried out in the area.

The natural interest of this area, where we can find significant species both in terms of their interest at the European or national level and/or the great importance of their protection and preservation, has led it to be included within the Natura 2000 network of key breeding and resting sites for rare and threatened species. These species include plants such as autumn-flowering crocus (*Crocus nudiflorus*), Majorca St John's wort, the native shrub gatova (*Genista valdes-bermejoi*), wild cyclamen (*Cyclamen balearicum*), holm oak, fan palm, sawfly orchid, juniper, myrtle, and so on.

The fauna to be found in this area includes long-eared owl, nightingale, Balearic warbler, Eurasian blue tit and Eurasian wren. Also of great interest is the native species of scorpion, the *Euscorpium balearicus*.
