

After training as an artist in a number of schools, universities and artistic residences in Barcelona, in 2015 he returned to the island to set up a studio in Sa Fàbrica. His works have been exhibited in a number of galleries such as Ferran Cano, Maior or CCA Andratx.

This work is based on technological references and shows how the artificial world interacts with the organic context.

The elements that make up the digital image have been transferred to painting, distorting them with data editing programs in order to confer a new significance on them. In a return to the question of perfection in digital aesthetics, the machine rebels in the event of a glitch or error in the representation systems, forming a breach that enables us to rummage beneath the shiny surface.

# Crithmum

Artist: Dafne Tree (Jaén, 1988)

Her early ventures into street art began in 2005, after obtaining a degree in Fine Arts from Seville University. After undertaking further training in the UK, she moved to Valencia where she is currently studying for a PhD at the Polytechnic University (UPV) and is a member of the teaching staff at the Valencia Institute of Modern Art.

This mural painting is the result of various architectural references included in the archaeological heritage of the municipality of Calvià, such as the Roman archaeological site of Sa Mesquida in Santa Ponça, the prehistoric constructions known as talaiots or the more recent abandoned military structures.

This random reinterpretation of significant elements, in opposition to our collective memory, creates a degree of visual discomfort when faced with the significance of the ruins of today that stand shoulder-to-shoulder with those of the past.
